Financial and legal matters

- Is a family member or caregiver taking or managing your money without your permission, or threatening to move you if you don't give them money?
- Has someone forged your signature on a document?
- Does your family member or a caregiver ask for money on a regular basis for themselves?
- Is anyone preventing you from getting legal assistance? Has someone asked you to sign documents like a Power of Attorney document to let them make decisions for you?
- Is someone asking you to sign a document when you aren't ready or willing to?
- Is someone threatening to reveal your immigration status or did they take immigration documents from you?

Did you know?

Over 60,000 older adults live in DeKalb County, and that number grows every year.



Growing older and staying safe

Elder abuse is a term that refers to any knowing, intentional, or negligent act by a caregiver or any other person that causes harm or a serious risk of harm to an older adult.

Did you know?

There are many programs that offer help tailored to realizing and maintaining a quality life.

Under Georgia law, abuse may be:

- Physical abuse** - Inflicting, or threatening to inflict, physical pain or injury on a vulnerable elder, depriving them of a basic need, or non-consensual sexual contact of any kind.
- Emotional abuse** - Inflicting mental pain, anguish, or distress on an elder through verbal or nonverbal acts.
- Neglect** - Failing to provide essential services that results in harm or threatens to harm elders.
- Financial exploitation** - The illegal or improper use of an elder's resources for another's profit or gain.

Seniors deserve to be treated with dignity and respect. No one should compromise the safety, finances, mobility or health of yourself or a senior that you know. This brochure lists some common health and safety concerns that you or older adults you know may face and gives you some resources for help.

Your physical safety

- Do you feel safe when your family members are with you?
- Is someone in your family hitting, pushing, kicking, or restraining you?
- Is a family member or caregiver calling you terrible names and/or saying mean things to you?
- Is your family member or caregiver making you feel sad after talking with them?
- Is a family member or caregiver threatening you with being placed in a nursing home or putting you out on the street?
- Has someone touched you inappropriately or in a way you did not like? Do you know someone experiencing these things?
