Kyra Hanlon has been advocating for survivors since college, where she served as a Sexual Assault Peer Educator, supported efforts to reauthorize key legislation protecting survivors, and worked to improve university policies for student safety and support. She has led community engagement initiatives since 2017, first in Memphis, TN, and later in Washington, DC, at Georgetown University. Her approach prioritizes collaboration and shared leadership, recognizing that community members are the experts in their own experiences. She has facilitated a wide range of initiatives, from neighborhood tax clinics to immersive learning experiences connecting individuals with local and global leaders. She also served as an Adjunct Faculty member at Georgetown University and holds a Bachelor's degree in Culture and Politics, as well as a Master's in Human Resource Management, with a focus on fostering inclusive and equitable workplaces.

Currently, Kyra serves as the Director of Community Engagement at the Women's Resource Center to End Domestic Violence. In this role, she leads volunteer engagement efforts, recruiting, training, and organizing opportunities for volunteers to contribute meaningfully. Additionally, Kyra develops and implements educational initiatives, planning community events such as the annual Candlelight Vigil and awareness campaigns for key issues impacting survivors. Through her leadership, Kyra fosters strong relationships between the Center and the broader community, increasing awareness and support for those impacted by domestic violence.
